

## SCHEDULE OF LICENSING CONDITIONS

### MANDATORY CONDITION: SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - a. at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - b. at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### MANDATORY CONDITION: IRRESPONSIBLE PROMOTIONS

1. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
2. An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises:-
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
  - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

### MANDATORY CONDITION: FREE TAP WATER

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

## **MANDATORY CONDITION: PROOF OF AGE SCHEME**

- (a) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (b) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (c) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
  - (i) a holographic mark, or
  - (ii) an ultraviolet feature.

## **MANDATORY CONDITION: REQUIREMENT TO MAKE SMALL ALCOHOL MEASURES AVAILABLE**

The responsible person shall ensure that:-

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
  - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
  - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
  - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

## **MANDATORY CONDITION: SALE OF ALCOHOL - DUTY + VAT**

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
  - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(a);
  - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
where—
    - (i) P is the permitted price,
    - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
  - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
  - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(a).

## **MANDATORY CONDITION: EXHIBITION OF FILMS**

The admission of children to film exhibitions is to be restricted in accordance with film classification recommendations made by the British Board of Film Classification.

## **MANDATORY CONDITION: DOOR SUPERVISORS**

Any individual(s) at the premises carrying out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority, as required by section 21 of the Licensing Act 2003.

## **CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH OPERATING SCHEDULE:**

### **1. General**

- a. This application is made as the previous Premises Licence has lapsed. Please note: the application may however be amended during the application period to reflect any agreements that may be reached with the responsible authorities and other parties.

### **2. Prevention of Crime and Disorder**

- a. CCTV is installed inside and outside the property, images will be maintained for 28 days. Staff will exercise zero tolerance in respect of rude and disruptive behaviour.
- b. Staff will refuse to serve under age customers.
- c. The safe and responsible folder will be updated and presented upon request to an officer of a Responsible Authority.

### **3. Public Safety**

- a. Fire alarms are installed, will be operational and maintained. External lighting is provided at the premises and will be maintained.
- b. All safety equipment will be regularly checked and maintained and staff will be trained to deal with emergencies.
- c. Risk assessments will be carried out on a regular basis and monitored.

#### **4. The Prevention of Public Nuisance**

- a. Full training will be provided to staff on the law relating to age restricted products and refresher training will be undertaken every 6 months.
- b. Records detailing the training will be kept on the premises and produced to an officer of a Responsible Authority.
- c. The Challenge 25 age verification policy will be in operation at the premises
- d. Clear and prominent signage will be in place enforcing the age verification policy.

#### **5. The Protection of Children from Harm**

- a. Full training will be provided to staff on the law relating to age restricted products and refresher training will be undertaken every 6 months.
- b. Records detailing the training will be kept on the premises and produced to an officer of a Responsible Authority.
- c. The Challenge 25 age verification policy will be in operation at the premises
- d. Clear and prominent signage will be in place enforcing the age verification policy.

#### **Conditions consistent with measures agreed with Principal Environmental Health Officer**

- 1 The doors leading into the outside space from the basement floor must be closed except for access. The intervening lobby door should be closed except for access. The doors should be self-closing to prevent noise escape from the venue. This condition applies during live and/or recorded music activities.
- 2 Live and/or Recorded Music is not permitted outside in the yard area.
- 3 The doors leading from the fire escape from the Ground Floor and First Floor must be closed except for access in an emergency to prevent noise escape from the venue. This condition applies during live and/or recorded music activities.
4. The outside area to the rear of the building shall be restricted to the hours of 12:00 until 21:00 for the purposes of eating and drinking only. Outside of these hours, the area shall only be used by people wanting to smoke.
